- Technical Committee reports to CEO, provides advice to Board
- Chair appointed by CEO open call
- Members appointed by Chair open call

#### Committee Structure



According to the RCA UC <u>Terms of Reference</u>:

"...up to six members selected for their knowledge of umpiring, capacity in policy development, and capability and willingness to undertake committee work. A minimum of one member of the UC shall be a licensed FISA umpire"

"...selected through a structured application process"

# 2018/2019 Accomplishments

- Finalize Terms of Reference; <u>Umpire Licensing Policy</u>
- Recruiting four new clinicians (BC, ON, QC)
- National Jury appointments made 2019, announcement for 2020 Juries
- Umpire uniform survey, report, decision, new kit confirmed
- Coastal Task Force started
- Level 4 training materials developed
- Umpire Handbook developed
- Umpire Accountability Framework
- Updated RCA UC and PRA Roles and Responsibilities
- 2 meetings with PRA UC Chairs / Umpire Coordinators



## 2020 Planned

- Umpire uniform stocking and supplying uniform pieces
- Coastal Task Force delivers umpires training module, recommendations to Rules changes, overview for O.C.s and Juries
- National Supported Juries review criteria
- Chief Umpire Seminar
- Rules of Racing review
- Umpire Development Program
- Level 1 clinic delivered via webinar



## Recruitment

- We need to refresh the umpire cadre, younger, more diverse
- Best people to recruit umpires are umpires you know what's involved and why you do it
- Umpire <u>training pathway</u>
- Masters athletes, Seniors, National Team alumni—approach them and make the pitch
- If everyone in the room recruited one twentysomething by this time next year, B.C. would be leading the country!



#### **Final Points**

- Sanctions Chief Umpires need to be involved in the development of the sanction application
- Evaluation Umpire evaluation was introduced in 2011 by the RCA Board through <u>Policy</u>. Umpires need to be evaluated in 3 of 5 stations once every three years.
- Safe Sport more work to come Discipline Policy
