68: Marinas, ...; Pleasure craft.

69: Pleasure craft.

72: Maritime support; Pleasure craft.

73: Also SAR Aircraft ...

## Radio controls

#### Volume (10 +/-) and Squelch (2 - 4)

- Button & Function display screen\*
- Knobs\*\* have ease of use, but same risk of increasing Squelch (increasing blocks weaker transmissions) instead of Volume
- \* ICOM **IC-M37** / IC-M36
- \*\* West Marine VHF255 / VHF155 (un-Lock when powered off); Other (older) models do not float

#### Power (transmit)

 Low is OK for 2,000 m line-of-sight if radio has not deteriorated

# Protocol / Etiquette

- Think about your message
- Ensure no one else is in the midst of a conversation
- Push to talk
- Take a breath
- Official radio protocol to begin a conversation is to state who you are calling (3 times), followed by "this is", who you are, and end by saying "Over". Wait for a response.
- Keep all messages SHORT, and end by saying "Over".
